# What should you be working on this week?

# Week of December 10 to 14

# What should you be working on this week?

This is the week where you show that you know how to conduct research outside of Social Studies class. There will be some time conducting research in class this week but you will be expected to have evidence (on Friday) to show that you spent **at least an hour** of research outside of class. Make sure to log your time below.

Remember, if you want to work in a group, you and your prospective partner(s) must be collecting sources and notes that are different from one another! The point of being in a group is to get more done than an individual can...three people do three times the work not a third each! In case that math lesson failed you, two people=twice the work. Four people=four times. Five people=five times the work. Oh, and that also means 2-5 times the sources!

KEYWORDS! What are keywords for your project? Ask now because you'll need a list by Friday. These will help you research. If you are struggling, these will definitely help you be successful in your research. We expect you to have at least 3 REALLY GOOD NEW SOURCES by Friday of this week! GET SEARCHING!!! # What should you be working on this week?

Right now you have your detective hat on and you are GATHERING sources. Use the Bibliography Matrix paper to help you figure out where to look. You need to have a lot of SOLID, QUALITY sources and USEFUL notes from those sources by January 3. R U on track?

Go to the library in your neighborhood. It's FREE. Go online to more than just google. Ask people you know about your topic. Think like a

detective looking for clues to tell the story of your topic. Remember to use KEYWORDS to look for information. Don't just search for the same thing. What are other keywords associated with your topic that you can search for? Remember, Central America is sometimes called Mesoamerica or Latin America—you should search using all terms! It's like if somebody said, "Do you know Matt?" and you said, "No, but I know Matthew." Same person but different names. Also realize that the more you search and read and experiment with your searches, the better you'll get. ALSO...be sure to chat with your Social Studies teacher THIS WEEK about your readiness for the January 3 Research Check-In #1. Winter Break is a good time to get work done so be ready to go.

# What should you be working on this week?

Are you struggling to find sources? Go to the Salk History Day website on www.RonHustvedt.com and click for help! Then go to a library near your home and ask for help! Be polite but be persistent and keep asking if you don't find what you need! There is awesome information out there just waiting for you to find it. Your detective work continues. Have you searched on the computer yet? No, have you REALLY searched on the computer? Have you been to the Salk

Media Center webpage links? If not, this is the week to do that! Use your Bibliography Matrix to help you.

When taking notes be sure to remember: WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, WHY, HOW, SO WHAT, NOW WHAT. Think about and try to find sources that tell you why your topic was important in history. How was your topic significant to the world? Why should people care about your topic today? What makes your topic a Turning Point? What reactions did people have? What else was going on in the world that made your topic possible?

Get it organized now and make sure you have it all!!! Be sure to log your time over winter break using the boxes below. Do you understand the historical context of your topic (how it connects to other events in history before/after that resulted from it)? The research process is still going HARD! Now you should also be ANALYZING your sources. What patterns do you notice? What connections can you make? Have you done an interview with an expert? Why not? Is your Bibliography being put together? Now would be a good time to be typing in your bibliographic citations rather than waiting until the last minutes. Start organizing your notes. If you have EasyBib you can color code your notes too!

Remember, things always seem like they'll be easy to do until you actually sit down to do them. The phrase "Slow and Steady Wins the Race" has been around a long time for a reason—it works! Don't wait until the last minute, even if you like to, because no matter what you'll always run out of time.

#### DEADLINE DATE ALERT—"PROJECT OUTLINE" DUE ON MONDAY!!! YOUR ROUGH DRAFT IS DUE NEXT WEEK TOO! REMEMBER: A ROUGH DRAFT IS THE FIRST FINISHED DRAFT—IT HAS TO LOOK GOOD!

Holy Cow! February is alrady here? You need to have your project FINISHED very soon! The Outline is your project organizer. Do a

good job with it and you'll see that it quickly becomes a Rough Draft. The Rough Draft and organizer are meant to be your final project. Will there be more to do? Yes, much more. But the more you put into the outline and rough draft, the nicer your final project will be AND the more you'll be able to pace yourself and do a good job over the next month.

Let's chat about that Rough Draft...It must look good. It must look finished. You should have had a few people look it over (parents, teacher, friends, experts) and give you some advice. You should have a plan/idea of what you are going to fix for the final draft. Does your project comply with all the History Day rules? Does your project look good and read good? Does it show historical context? Does it show analysis? Does it go beyond just telling information and actually interpreting events? A Rough Draft can be easy but a good rough draft is tough! Remember this, a rough draft is a FINISHED draft. It's not in pieces, it's FINISHED with a few technical things to fix, update, tweak, etc.

Don't stress out. Relax. If you are confused or stressed please talk with your teacher right away. You don't need to feel that way if you've been doing everything you are supposed to. A little bit of feeling like that is good, in fact it's part of the learning process. But if it's overwhelming, or seems overwhelming, talk with somebody who can help you get a good perspective on what to do!
