In answer to your letter of July 10th, 1922 in regards to Max Mason, will say that my first acquaintence with him was when I took charge of his defense together wither others arrested at the same time and om the same charge on June 15th, 1920 and saw him very often on my many calls at the County Jail, this City.

From all the contact, and knowledge I gained of him personally, I found him to be of a well behaved character, earnest, honest and true and from all the inquiry I made concerning him and learned from all who visited him while in jail and from the sheriff and his officers who hads immediate charge of him informed me that he was a man of good behavior and honest.

I am enclosing a copy of the Supreme Courts opinion both affirming his conviction and dissenting opinion of Justices Hallam and Dibell in the same hearing that you may know the details of the cause of his imprisonment.

Hoping this will afford you the proper information asked for.
